# Exciting news at Donelson Middle School: Keith Proffitt and Thomas Spann are returning!

YEAH!'s Rock Block Metro Nashville Public Schools program, in partnership with Global Outreach Developments International's CASE After School Program, kicks off next week! This 10-week, twice-a-week program will build upon last semester's Hip-hop and percussion classes, showcasing songwriting, vocals, entrepreneurial skills and small and large group performances on April 27!

**Keith Proffitt** aka Remsteele is an artist & producer born in Mobile, AL. His musical journey began at Vigor High School, where he participated in the choir under the guidance of Mr. Don Gardner. It was here that he honed many skills including piano and harmonizing.

Keith's career took a significant turn when he joined the band UNEEKE, leading to a record deal with Bellmark Records in the late 90s. As a label mate with renowned artists like Prince, Tag Team, Johnny Guitar Watson and Jody Watley, Keith gained valuable experiences that shaped his artistic trajectory.

He later embarked on a solo career and established himself as a producer both locally and nationally. He founded his publishing company, BEATZFOREVER ENT, showcasing his entrepreneurial spirit. In 2006 he landed a record deal with SonyRed and moved to Nashville. Over the years, he has released three albums from the Nashville area and has become a prominent figure in the city's music scene, hosting events throughout.

During Covid, Keith worked as a facilitator for SoundCorp, a nonprofit organization out of Chattanooga, contributing to the funding of over \$100,000 to help artists in that area. His role involved instructing and mentoring artists about navigating the music industry and fostering an entrepreneurial mindset.

Since 2017, Keith has been a facilitator for YEAH! Programs being, where he became the first to teach on the elements of Hip-hop. His commitment involves educating youth on the importance of the history and culture of Hip-hop, leaving a lasting impact on the participants he engages with.

**Thomas Spann Jr.** was born in Charleston, SC, and a native of Eadytown, South Carolina, growing up under the musicianship of his father Thomas Lee Spann Sr. who inspired him to play the drums. His high school band director, Mack Guice II influenced him to pursue a career in music. Having these two giants in his life has propelled him towards finesse as a percussionist in academia and the music industry.

Mr. Spann graduated Cum Laude from Benedict College, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music. He then forged ahead and earned a Master of Science degree in Music Education from Tennessee State University. Currently, he is pursuing a Doctorate of Educational Leadership Degree, EdD at Trevecca Nazarene University. This distinction has set him apart from the drummers of the world to being established as an accomplished percussionist. His extensive genre skill has afforded him the opportunity to record music with The Jonathan Pierce Band, Chris Simmons Jazz Trio, Cat Parks and Kindred Souls, Curtis Fields, Blended 328, and Dr. Sean Daniels. He has performed throughout the United States and abroad in Central Asia, Russia, Zimbabwe, Africa, Brazil, the Middle East, and Mexico.

In academia, Mr. Spann currently serves as a Music/Drumline Teacher at I.T. Creswell Middle Magnet Performing Arts School, serves as a Teaching-Artist at The National Museum of African American Music, percussion/drum educator at Creative Soul Music Academy and Fork's Drum Closet. He also served as Adjunct Professor, Marching Band Director, Percussion, World Music, and Music Education at Fisk University; and formerly served as Adjunct Professor in Applied Percussion at Tennessee State University. Within the music industry, Mr. Spann is the drummer for Sonja Hopkins, DSD Jazz Quartet, and various other artists.

Additionally, Mr. Spann is endorsed by Pearl/Adams Percussion, Regal Tip drumsticks; and is a songwriter with BMI music, and a sound designer with Sounds.com
